Research

My academic interests lie in the field of Enlightenment ethics and natural law in the 18th century. I am best known for my early research on aristocratic culture which resulted in the monographs *Habsburgischer Adel und Aufklärung* (Stuttgart, Franz Steiner Verlag, 2010), and *Šlechtická kultura v 18. století* [Aristocratic culture in the 18th century] (Prague, NLN 2011). My interest in higher education grew into a general history of Enlightenment moral philosophy in Bohemia which has been outlined in *The Enlightenment in Bohemia. Morality, religion, and multiculturalism* (Oxford, Voltaire Foundation, 2011), a collective volume which I co-edited. After that, I continued with research into the dark irrational side of the Enlightenment which culminated in my most recent monograph *Aufklärung oder Illuminismus? Die Enzyklopädie des Grafen Franz Joseph Thun* (Stuttgart, Franz Steiner Verlag, 2015) and the collective monograph *Casanova: Enlightenment philosopher* (Oxford, Voltaire Foundation, 2016). Since 2011 I have begun to focus on natural law and human rights. I have been studying these phenomena in a broad European and American context. The preliminary results have been published in a number of articles and in a Czech collective volume, *The Habsburgs 1740–1918. The Making of a Civil Society* (Prague, NLN 2016), which I edited.
